A few examples of assessment of sea-going service on non-trading ships are given in table below:

(g) Tugs employed beyond smooth or partially smooth waters, Salvage vessels.	< 500	NWKO (NCV) 2/3 of actual sea-going service (Ref. MS (STCW) Rules 17 (2) (ii))
	≥ 500	Home – Trade (NCV)
(h) Trawlers or deep sea fishing vessels (i) Sailing cum power propelled yachts	< 500	NWKO (NCV) 2/3 of actual sea-going service (Ref. MS (STCW) Rules 17 (2) ii))
